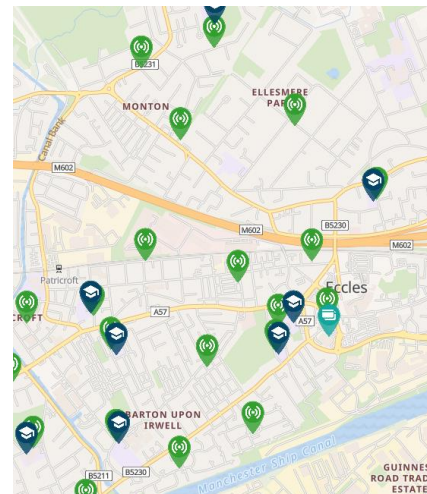
The game started on Wednesday 24th September 2025 and ends on Wednesday 5th November 2025. Children were given games cards this week which enables children and
