
Next week, our focuses are Ramadan and the launch of Art Week, as part of our Literature and The Arts provision.






which was closely followed by a 'Word Parade' where children shared their outfits that illustrated their favourite words.

<u>Fasting</u>

A letter has been sent home with our Y5 and Y6 children regarding fasting. The holy month of Ramadan is approaching and we are aware that this is an extremely important time for our Muslim families. I understand that when children reach puberty they are expected to fast, this is usually around the age of 13 – 14 years old (A number of our Y5 and Y6 children have expressed the desire to fast; here at school we will support their decision and make arrangements for them at lunchtime.) To enable us to do this, if you would like your child to fast then please complete the slip on the letter that has been sent home. Our policy is that children should have a parents written permission in order to fast. Our children will be expected to continue to learn to the best of their ability and we require that every pupil participate in the whole curriculum including PE, Music, etc. If at any time your child wishes to stop fasting, then please let staff know as soon as possible so lunch arrangements can be made. Good communication is essential in order that we can support your children and make appropriate provision for them here in school during this special month.

Breakfast Club

Just like adults (including me!) some mornings children can wake up and feel a little under the weather and be reluctant to come to school. Our Breakfast Club is open from 8am and staffed by Mrs Simpson and Mrs Bradford (our Thrive and Mental Health Leads) who are available to help and support children on arrival at school. There's no need to book or ring first. This service is open to anyone who needs it.
