

Safeguarding

The arrangements for safeguarding are effective.

Leaders and governors place a high priority on safeguarding pupils. They ensure that staff are well trained in how to keep pupils safe. Staff pass on concerns to those leaders responsible for safeguarding in a timely fashion. This enables leaders to make sure that the right support is in place for potentially vulnerable pupils.

Pupils understand the need to keep themselves safe. They describe with ease the many ways that they can do this. For example, pupils know how to stay safe while they are online. They learn who they can trust. Pupils know what action to take if they feel unsafe.

From time to time, reports have been shared with school of children misbehaving online, out of school, that has caused a high level of stress and anxiety to a group of our pupils.

To support our children in helping to keep them safe, I am asking parents/ carers to check your children's phones and groups they are in. If you come across anything you consider to be bullying (Cyber Bullying) as a parent/carer you can report this straight to CEOP (child exploitation and online protection) or you can ring 101 to report the incident of bullying.

We also want to make you aware the legal ages for the popular apps your children may be accessing:

- Facebook 13 years +
- Instagram 13 years +
- TIKTOK 13 years +
- Snap Chat 13 years +
- WhatsApp 16 years +
- YouTube 18 years but 13 years with permission of parent.
- Discord 13years +

Part of your duty of care as a parent/carer is to report to the police any online activity that is a criminal offence (children 10 and over are at the age of criminal conviction) including:

- Sexting (sending indecent pictures to each other)
- Bullying (any aggressive or threatening messages between peers)
- Fraudulent use of others information (pretending to be someone they are not)

St Andrews will continue to work with the local authority to give children as much information as possible but can we please remind parents that it's your responsibility to monitor your child's activity online. Thank you for your support with this matter

Enterprise Trophy Winner


