Bible Reading

Creative Prayer 1 \approx Fish acrostic

Learn to pray the Fish Way - Draw and cut out a Fish shape. Write the word FISH as an acrostic. Then thinking of St Andrew or Jesus as people, write a word next to each letter for example: F=Faithful I=Integrity S=Strong H=Honest. Then as you pray focus on each letter and think about how you could demonstrate these things everyday in your own life.

Creative Prayer 2 ≈ **Footstep Prayer Trail**

This is something to do with other people in the household. Cut a number of footsteps shapes out of some paper 12 is the same number of disciples. Write something to pray bout on each one like asking God to help you to look after the world, the name of someone you want to pray with — you could each do a few of them. Find a space inside or out doors and lay them out. Take it in turns to go along the trail you have made, stopping at each footstep and praying for the thing that is on there.

Activity $2 \approx Go Fish$.

You will need a pack of playing cards (a standard pack is 52 without the jokers) or make your own with any kind of picture you like! The aim of the game is to make as many sets of 4 as you can—for example, 4 threes or 4 queens. Each player is dealt 5 cards and the rest of the deck goes face down in the middle. The youngest begins and chooses another player to ask if they have , for example, any threes? If the player does, they must hand them over and the first player can chose to ask the same or another player for another number. If when asked the player has none, they say 'go fish' and the player asking must pick up a card. Then the game continues with the next player.

When any player has four cards of one face value, it forms a set and the cards must be placed face up in front of that player. When all the cards have been laid down in sets,
